We can't say thank you enough to everyone that supported our efforts during Child Abuse Prevention Month in April.

Sunlight Child Advocacy Center had a very successful Blue Ribbon Campaign, "Every Child Matters." **Andover Central High School** displayed blue ribbons on their trees outside of the school; **El Dorado Middle School Circle of Friends & Kay Club** assembled blue ribbons for distribution (pictured top right); **Grandview Elementary 5th grade Adopt-a-Class Mentoring Program** created a blue ribbon tree bulletin board (pictured top left) and artwork for child abuse prevention;



Jefferson, Lincoln, Grandview, and Skelly Elementary in El Dorado, **Seal Elementary** in Douglass, **Timbuktu Bar & Grill** in Andover, and **Emprise Bank** participated in our wear blue sticker campaign and raised \$1,500; **USD 490** posted information about Child Abuse Prevention on their website; informational tables (pictured middle left) were set up at libraries in **Howard, Moline, Longton, Grenola, Hamilton, Madison, Eureka, Whitewater, Douglass, Augusta** and **Towanda**, the **Eureka Courthouse, Rose Hill City Hall, Benton Days**, and the **Cassoday Bike Run**;

Proclamations were sent to all **City Commissions/Councils** and **County Commissions** in **Butler, Elk, and Greenwood Counties**; **SKT Telephone** and the cities of **Andover, Augusta, and El Dorado** ran prevention slides on their city channels; **El Dorado Civic Center** (pictured below), **Armfield Dentistry** and **GoJoes Coffee and Gas in Augusta** (pictured middle right) displayed prevention messages; the **City of El Dorado** included a prevention message on their city utility bills and coordinated pinwheels in flower pots (pictured right) and blue ribbons on light poles around downtown;



Butler County Times-Gazette, Eureka Harold, Potwin City Newsletter, Madison News, Taylor News, and Douglass Bull Dog Growl published articles; **Butler County Health Department** created a blue ribbon tree representing each child seen in the month of April (pictured above); **First United Methodist Church in El Dorado** colored a pinwheel garden; **Fire and Police Departments** tied blue ribbons on their vehicles; and **Wheat State Telephone** and **New Beginnings CDDO** wore blue and blue ribbons.
