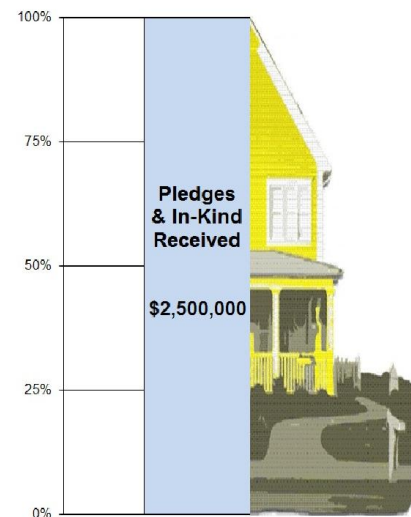
Thank you to all who attended our first annual Sporting Clay Shoot on May 22nd at the Murphy and Sons course in Augusta! It was a
