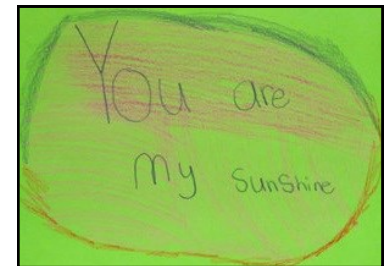

**Children served at Sunshine Children's Home-** Sunshine Children's Home served a total of 82 children during the months of December and January, with residents ranging from 11 days to 17 years old. In these months, three new counties utilized our facility, bringing the total number of Kansas counties served since opening to 57 counties. As of January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017 SCH has officially served 1,003 children.
